Salts or esters of carbamic acid, $\text{H}_2\text{NC}(=\text{O})\text{OH}$, or of N -substituted carbamic acids $\text{R}_2\text{NC}(=\text{O})\text{OR}'$, (R' = hydrocarbyl or a cation). The esters are often called urethanes or urethans, a usage that is strictly correct only for the ethyl esters.
